### **Minister of Foreign Affairs**

Lawyer by the Pontifical Catholic University of Peru. Doctor of Law by the Alcalá de Henares University in Spain. Post-doctorate in Law at the University of Bayreuth and at the Max-Planck-Institut in Heidelberg, Germany.

Magistrate of the Constitutional Court of Peru from 2004 to 2010 and President of the same court between 2006–2008. He has been Judge ad hoc of the Inter-American Court of Human Rights between 2003-2014. Vice Minister of the Ministry of Justice of Peru in 2004. Former Dean of the Law School of the Pontifical Catholic University of Peru between 2012–2014.

He is the main professor of Constitutional Law at the Pontifical Catholic University of Peru and at the National University of San Marcos. He has been a visiting professor at the Pompeu Fabra University, the University of León and the Castilla-La Mancha University, in Spain. Doctor honoris causa in five Peruvian universities.

Currently, he is a member of the Study Group on Constitutional Justice and Fundamental Rights in Latin America of the Konrad Adenauer Stiftung, Vice President of the International Association of Constitutional Law, commissioner of the International Commission of Jurist; patron of the World Law Foundation; member of the network of constitutionalists and internationalists of the Ibero-American Colloquium of the Max-Planck-Institut für ausländisches öffentliches Recht und Völkerrecht in Heidelberg (Germany) and; ordinary member of the Spanish Constitutionalist Association.

Corresponding member of the Peruvian section of *Diritto Pubblico Comparato ed Europeo* of Italy; member of the Scientific Committee for Latin America of the journal of Italian public, community and comparative law “*federalismi.it*”; of the Advisory Council of the Ibero-American Yearbook of Constitutional Justice, magazine of the Center for Constitutional Political Studies of Spain; of the advisory council of the Magazine of the General Courts of Spain; of the Journal of Constitutional Law of Turkey; and, of the Editorial Committee of the Human Rights Yearbook of the University of Chile.
